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Self-explaining Road?:













Directive for facilitating the cross-border exchange of information on road safety related traffic offences (2011/82/EU) (CBE)

Objectives:

- Road safety improvement through increasing a deterrent enforcement effect
- Equal treatment of resident and non-resident offenders
- Better convergence of control measures between Member States
- Cross-border exchange of vehicle registration data (VRD) for certain offences:
- a) speeding
- b) non-use of a seat-belt
- failing to stop at a red traffic light
- d) drink-driving

- e) driving under the influence of drugs
- f) failing to wear a safety helmet
- g) use of a forbidden lane
- h) Illegally using a mobile telephone or any other communication devices while driving

Road safety challenges for Europe:



- Over the last two decades, the number of <u>fatalities</u> in the EU decreased considerably
- But:
 - this reduction is significantly under the target
 - the reduction has become marginal in the last years
 - there is barely decrease in injuries.
- The implications of deaths, injuries and property damage resulting from road crashes are still unacceptably high
- There is a growing need to merge policy, research, implementation and controlling
