It is estimated that in Europe six out of ten work accidents resulting in death are road crashes, including both crashes while driving for work and commuting crashes (Eurogip).

PRAISE addresses all safety aspects of driving 'at' work and driving 'to' work. Its aim is to "praise" best practices in order to help employers secure high road safety standards for their employees.

PRAISE aims to:

- advance the need for work-related Road Safety Management and provide the knowhow to employers who must take on that challenge.
- raise the work-related road safety standards of EU Member States and carry out advocacy work at the EU level: work-related road safety is an area of road safety policy that needs renewed political commitment.
- communicate the message that work-related road safety should include road safety 'at' work (driving on duty) but also road safety 'to' work (commuting).

Within this project, three thematic reports will cover annually different work-related road safety topics. Moreover, three fact sheets will annually document success stories to illustrate the thematic reports. Eventually, a road safety manual will be published

collecting all the thematic reports. Every year ETSC will also organise two country seminars bringing together road safety professionals and national decision makers to discuss occupational road safety and an annual Award will be presented to one employer who will be identified for taking on the road safety challenge successfully.
